Covid19

The news has been full of Omicron variant and please note the advice around having to self isolate regardless of your vaccination status or Lateral flow or PCR tests if one of your contacts tests positive for Omicron.

Covid Figures (Non Omicron variant) update

The rate of infections across the district has increased to 537/100,000 from 463 last week, the over 60's rate has decreased to 89/100,000 (120 last week) with 38 cases over the last seven days. Other districts rates in Warwickshire, for all ages, are Nuneaton & Bedworth 450/100,000, North Warwickshire 472/100,000, Warwick 394/100,000 and Rugby 387/100,000. Warwickshire overall has increased slightly from 441/100,000 to 448/100,000. England 436/100,000.

HOWEVER WE MUST NOT BE COMPLACENT AS CASES IN OUR WARD ARE HIGHER THAN THE DISTRICT AVERAGE – IRRESPECTIVE WHETHER WE HAVE 70 OR 700 CASES per 100,000 we must all STILL be sensible and follow guidance etc,

There have been no further Covid related death this week across Stratford District (total now 152 from the start of this second wave (28th August 2020) 37 occurring in care homes, 102 in hospital, two in a hospice and 10 at home and one in a communal establishment, out of a total of 1,728 all cause deaths in the district for this new second wave period.

The cumulative total of deaths across Warwickshire for Wave 2 increased by 7 this week (786) with a total of 7,340 all cause deaths. The cumulative total of Covid-19 deaths in Stratford district is 320 since the start of the pandemic and in Warwickshire 1,386 (11,724 total deaths).

Arranging vaccination transport for 1st, 2nd, or booster doses

Transport to COVID-19 vaccination appointments has been arranged with the volunteer transport providers that cover Warwickshire, they are working to a standard operating process that includes use of PPE and appropriate cleaning schedules. Currently this transport is being provided free of charge. It can be requested if residents have no other safe way of accessing vaccination sites, including initially asking households and bubbles for support. This is to retain capacity in the system.

Poultry and Captive Bird Keepers Guidance

AVIAN INFLUENZA PREVENTION ZONE REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL POULTRY AND CAPTIVE BIRD KEEPERS
Keep free-ranging birds in fenced areas to minimise contact with wild birds, neigbouring poultry or captive birds.
Inspect outdoor areas, removing wild bird contaminants like faeces, feathers and wild bird carcases.
Fence off or put netting over areas of standing water or ponds.
Provide feed and water undercover, so wild birds can't access it.
Make your premises unattractive to wild birds. Use bird scarers, foils or streamers.
Keep ducks and geese separate from other poultry.
Store bedding under cover to reduce the risk of contamination.
Clean and disinfect footwear before and after tending to your birds. If you own more than 50 birds, place foot dips containing Government approved disinfectant at all entry and exit points.
Clean and disinfect hard surfaces regularly.
Clean and disinfect equipment and vehicles to avoid disease spread between premises.
Minimise the movement of people, vehicles and equipment to and from bird areas and keep records of movements.
Keep records of poultry, captive bird and egg movements.
Maintain buildings that house birds to prevent water ingress
Ensure pest control is effective.
Animal & Plant Health Agency
Non-compliance with these biosecurity measures may be an offence.

WCC Trading Standards Animal Health team is alerting Warwickshire poultry and captive bird keepers across the county to new bird housing measures that came into force on Monday 29th November 2021.
